DX-

Adam, VE4SN, reported conditions lately have been "so so" on some days and very busy on others.
Stations he said to look for are from Spratly Islands. A group of Malaysian amateurs are there operating QRP from April 10 to April 24 on 160 to 6 meters CW SSB and RTTY.

Adam also spoke on the 100 year anniversary of the Titanic sinking. There are a lot of stations on the air

starting April 10 in remembrance of this event and Adam said the one to look for is GR100MGY From the home town of Jack Philips who was the radio operator aboard the Titanic. Thanks to all those who participated in Exercise # 102, signal penetration testing at the Marathon Care Centre. For the 2011 Manitoba Marathon, operators shadowing key medical personnel were generally unable to access the Medical Net Repeater and found that using VHF simplex to connect with the Comm Centre was not always reliable. Our Bike Mobile operator has had difficulty in accessing the Medical Repeater when mobile in the Wolseley area. Thanks to Richard VE4ESX for building a 2m Yagi and bringing it out for testing. Thanks also to Darcy VE4DDW and Richard VE4KAZ for bringing out the portable UHF Repeater belonging to the Mobile Emergency Communication Group. We're going to do two things this year to ensure that medical "shadows" in the Care Centre can connect with the Medical Net controlled from the Comm Centre by going with a passive VHF antenna system at the Care Centre and utilizing the MEC Portable UHF Repeater just outside the Care Centre to connect to Net Controllers in the Marathon Comm Centre if necessary. We also tried alternating antennas for the Medical Repeater – thanks to University of Manitoba Amateur Radio Society for their on-going support by allowing use of VE4UMR and allowing the temporary antenna swapping for the day. The twelve participants were VE4s: ACX, AJO, SCH, STS, RST, ESX, CDM, DDW, KAZ, MBQ, Laurie Penton & Jeffrey Kazuk.



Good Luck In The Contest

Finding the Fox By Garth, VE4GWB

On Sunday, April 29th a group of 15 hunters headed out to the woods of Whittier Park to find the elusive fox in WARC's first Transmitter Hunt in a while. With presentations leading up to it including a video and tape measure RDF antenna build project. The weather was a bit on the cool side and a bit windy at times. The transmitter was hid at 1230hrs and the starting gun went of at 1300hrs.



First to find approximately 30 minutes in was Andy RDO, Rob TNT and Brian BCB. Minor equipment failure in the trees halted one team and the hunt concluded at 1436 hrs after the remaining teams located the little black box hidden within a pipe lying on the river bank nicely camouflaged. A decoy spool of wire hidden under leaves didn't fool most.







Though the location within view of the Richardson building was nice, the park proved to be too small to start off with the beams as the signal was pretty strong throughout the area. Despite the close proximity and cool temps a good time was had by all. Leaving the site discussions were had about a future location and staring point over a larger area of town.

Is D-star Amateur Radio? by, Glen, VE4GWN

I have heard, both on the air & over coffee that D-star isn't amateur radio. The normal reason given is because it uses computers. Yes it does! I have also heard that it is the same about Echo Link and IRLP. If someone were to turn back the clock there was the controversy about AM and SSB. A little further back, Morse Code & voice.

New modes seems to meet resistance in some ham circles. Like Echo Link you can connect computer to computer, or computer to radio using the internet. Unlike Echo Link you need to add a device to your computer (a DV Dongle) to use a computer on the system. You can also connect radio to radio direct or linking via the internet. Like IRLP, D-star uses the internet to link to other repeaters and reflectors. With IRLP a radio is needed by all users. All Echo Link and D-star (if linking) requires the user to register their callsign. IRLP node owners have to register their node, and must have a callsign to do so. This helps keep only hams on the system. There may be some pirated callsigns getting on the systems, registration helps.

The fun in the D-star system is the linking. You can link to individual users using callsign linking, link to other repeaters or even to link to reflectors.

As I write this I'm looking at reflector 001, http://ref001.dstargateway.org/, there are 52 repeaters linked including: XE2ITZ, VA7DIG, SV8Z, VK1RWN, GB7GD, ZL1VHD, PJ2A and more!

There are also 52 dongle/hotspot users monitoring this reflector! Link to that, and call CQ you can get an answer from who knows where!

Soon after the VE4WDR repeaters came on line I spoke to a gentleman, who got his licence before I was born. He lives in an antenna restricted community and can't hit any repeaters with a HT. He tried CQ100, didn't enjoy it due to too much computer! Echo Link was OK, but no surprises, you know who you are calling. With his DV dongle he connects to a reflector (normally reflector 001) you never know who will answer.

Is D-star amateur radio? To me and others it is! I have fun on HF, VHF/UHF locally, IRLP (Rosi and I have many friends we met on IRLP) and D-star (some of our IRLP friends also have D-star).

RAC Bulletin 2012-021E - Update on 60 Metres 2012-04-04

RAC has been pursuing channelized access to 60M since early 2010. Our request was for an allocation identical to the US allocation, with one additional unique Canadian channel, and with fewer restrictions (the US allocations were restricted to USB voice only, with power and antenna restrictions). Amateurs will recall that one of the rationales for RAC requesting a 60M allocation was to enhance emergency communications including cross-border interoperability. IC responded by indicating that they were prepared to support access in synch with US amateur allocation and regulations.

In late 2011, in response to an ARRL petition for change, the FCC issued a final Report and Order that, once it has been published in the Federal Register, will result in a change to the frequency of one of the channels and will enable the use of CW and data modes in addition to USB voice. These features had already been in the original RAC request. The FCC Report and Order has cleared the way for Canada to move ahead with finalizing its allocation to match the new US allocations, including the ability to use CW and data modes. This allocation, which will be on a secondary basis, requires a public consultation through the Canada Gazette, which RAC anticipates will occur in the second quarter of 2012.

It is important that Canadian Amateurs comment on the draft once released. RAC will continue to keep our members aware of the status of this important initiative.

An important offer has been made by IC with regards to 60M. Industry Canada is prepared to licence operators in channelized 60M operation pending the results of the consultation process. The licencing process will be managed out of ICs regional offices and is open to any Canadian amateur. The process requires a formal licence application, payment of a licence fee, and the use of a special call sign instead of the licensee's ama-

teur call sign. RAC regards this as an important interim step allowing amateurs to get on the air in the 60M band as soon as possible and thanks IC for this initiative. RAC's objective, however, is to ensure that Canadian amateurs have the 60M allocation available to all amateurs as part of their amateur radio certification, i.e. without licence applications, licence fees or special call signs. RAC is cautiously optimistic that this will come about in the summer of 2012.


If you wish to obtain a temporary, paid license to operate on 60M, please contact your local Industry Canada Regional Office to complete the application form. The total fee depends upon the date of your application but in any case is less than \$100.
