## Parkinson Superwalk By Dick VE4HK

The Parkinson Superwalk moved to its new venue at the University of Manitoba, for 2015. They outgrew their previous location, the French Cultural Centre. Last year, the Cultural Centre was very crowded. The Max Bell Centre had plenty of room. The organizers expected about 600 participants.

I requested and received permission to use VE4UMR from Wit VE4WK for our network,

I had all our volunteers meet behind the Max Bell Centre, by 8 am, to be certain of having a parking spot close by. We set up the WARES Boler trailer in the Max Bell parking lot.

David VE4DAR gave the pre-race briefing at 9:00 am. I added a few comments, then, everyone proceeded to their assigned locations. The walk began shortly after 10:00 am. I had been asked to lead the walk on my bike, which I did. I rode ahead of the lead pack, and stopped at corners, to ensure no one went astray. Once I completed the first lap, I rode the course several more times, watching for any entrants having difficulty, or going astray. Once we determined that there were no more walkers, I worked with Howard's Shadow to close down the course as I passed by each position, and allow our volunteers and Superwalk marshals to stand down

The net was conducted as a closed, directed net. This meant that all communications must go through net control. That worked out perfectly. There was no problem with the repeater, which is located on the  $\boldsymbol{U}$  of  $\boldsymbol{M}$  campus.

All walkers and volunteers (Pictured in ARES report) were back at the Max Bell Centre about 11 am.

## WARC History Follow-up... April 2004 email from Ralph Parker VE7XF

I enjoyed VE4YU's history of Winnipeg radio clubs on the WARC website, and perhaps have a bit to add. I was VE4SX, licensed in December 1954, while I was in high school. The earliest membership certificate in the ARLM that I have is dated 25 February, 1955.

Stu Talbot was VE4SR, at least when I took code and theory classes from him in 1954. He lived a few blocks east of my parent's house on Lorette Ave.

I don't remember the Amateur Radio Bugs of Winnipeg, but I do remember Ron Adamson, VE4TA. I would have held VE4SX for a year by December 1955.

I do have a membership certificate for the Winnipeg Ragchewers Radio Association for 1957, signed by John Robinson, VE4MS (President); Richard Pobuta, VE4SP (secretary); Ronald Adamson, VE4TA (Treasurer).

I worked for a time for CJOB, where Reg Durie, VE4RD, was chief engineer.

I left Winnipeg for Edmonton in July 1961, where I traded in my VE4SX call for VE6MC. I moved to the Vancouver area in 1966, received the call VE7AXM, and a year later changed to VE7XF, which I have held ever since. As I like to spend some time in Manitoba in the summer, I obtained the call VE4AKX (about 1996), and changed to VE4KX (which I still hold) a year later. I'll be hearing some of you again this summer, but mostly on 50 mhz.

Tnx for the memories. I had the most fun of all as VE4SX, starting with a 3 tube regen rcvr and a single 6AG7 on 80m CW. One of my early QSOs was with Ron Place, VE4PL (VE4PU in those days), and I still have a close friendship with him.
