CW Code Course 1 - Now Accepting Registrations

WARC is pleased to offer a hands-on CW training course for 2018. Learn to send and receive clear code. Learn the basics of operating on the HF bands as a real code warrior. Be confident as you sit down in front of your shiny new CW station.

The course will run from 9 January to 27 February, Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 7pm in the Seniors Club (598 St. Mary's Rd.) Expect about an hour per night, sometimes more, sometimes less.

Most nights students will have a chance to listen to real CW ops live on the radio (propagation allowing) and CW Ops Elmers will be available on some evenings live or by Skype. Remote operation may also be possible.

Prerequisite for this course is an amateur radio licence with HF privileges. Maximum number of students is 8, but a wait-list will be maintained.

No-code students will have precedence, but the rusty are welcome if they can bring their own paddles and keyers.

The Benefits of Memory Art Boyars VE4VTR/K3KU

I've been flailing around trying to fix HF RF-in-the-shack problems in my Maryland home station. The major manifestation is RF-in-the-mic, especially when I try to use computer-recorded messages for contesting. The problem is not surprising, as I'm playing the hand I was dealt. My only antenna is a 200-foot dipole, fed with ladder line and matched – fortuitously – by my transceiver's internal tuner. My basement shack does not have a good RF ground system.

A friend suggested that a choke balun might help. He loaned me one he had built: 16 turns of RG 58 on 4-inch diameter PVC pipe. It worked, sort-of. I think. Maybe. The RF-in-the-mic seemed lower on some bands, but the antenna matching fell apart. I couldn't get a match at all on one band. Technical note: a simple dipole fed with high-Z transmission line and an antenna tuner looks like a good approach for a multiband antenna, but you can get some weird impedances at the bottom end of the feedline, and it can vary wildly with feedline length.

Taking a non-scientific approach, I decided to try a longer coil and see what happened. (Actually, this was a good systems approach. It would take me much less time to build the new coil and try it than to learn how to do the analysis.) I had 40 feet or so of 50-year old RG 58 and the needed connectors. I set myself to getting out to the home supply store to get a couple of feet of 4-inch PVC pipe.

As I was readying breakfast the next morning I was prompted to remember what I had written about VE4YU (SK) for the Discover the HF Experience presentation in Winnipeg in April 2016. (See Cary

VE4EA's write-up of the presentation and my Remembrance of Ed Henderson, VE4YU in the Winnipeg ARC Newscaster for May 2016 winnipegarc.org/newscaster/ warcnews1605.PDF

Of course! I don't need any PVC pipe. Just finish off the oatmeal, and I'm all set.

And so I did. Here's the finished product. The antenna matching

still works on all bands; it's even a little improved. Unfortunately, the RF-in-the-mic is still there. I'll bet VE4YU could have told me what to do. 73, Old Man.

Any band, mode, even D-STAR & DMR.

Talk amongst your fellow digital enthusiasts to arrange contacts in DV simplex mode. For D-STAR set your radio to 145.670 or 446.100 in DV mode and UR field to CQCQCQ. For DMR, program your radio with 446.500, colour code 1, time slot.
