CQ Winnipeg Simplex By Garth VE4GWB

From March 8th to March 17th, set your VFO's to 146.520 for another Worked All Winnipeg QSO party. Let's see what our rigs can do without a repeater. From your home QTH on a base antenna, mobile or a portable with a 17" rubber duck try and log 25 (or more) contacts within the city of Winnipeg.

You are not limited to 2 meters. Any contact made direct between two stations without a repeater counts. Any band, mode, even D-STAR, DMR & Fusion. Make contact with fellow digital voice enthusiasts on analog and then QSY to another frequency to try digital. For D-STAR set your radio to 145.670 or 446.100 in DV mode and UR field to CQCQCQ. For DMR, program your radio with 446.500, color code 1, time slot 1. For Fusion try 145.690 or 446.125

No QSL cards needed. A copy of your log book with two other Hams who have checked your log and mail (unless you run into VE4HK at coffee) it with \$2.00 to cover the cost of the certificate and postage to:

Build or buy equipment? "We bought a used VHF/ UHF station and built our own antenna. We bought new HT's."

Any contacts or moments that stick out in memory? "On simplex, during a half-day atmospheric aberration, I talked with a ham in Alabama using a 2m J-pole. My first contact was Ron Norton VE4II, whom I knew from work at the U. of Winnipeg."

What have you gotten out of ham radio? "A lot of really good education and friendships. A lot of contentment and joy seeing Jared's involvement, especially when he was a teenager."

Particular interests in our hobby? "Everything except digital modes. I loved old tube receivers. At one point I had 137 that worked!"

Public Service? "Manitoba Marathons; air shows, dog sled races. Now as a Duty Officer at the Seniors Club."

Advice for New Hams? "Get on the radio. Operate and learn."

Future of Amateur Radio? "Amateur radio will always be here. Some day a burst of EMI will wipe out other communications, but amateur radio will still be here."

FRS & GMRS Difference in Canada & the USA Submitted by Derek VE4HAY

As many Amateur Radio operators know there is a radio service called the Family Radio Service (FRS) and another radio service called the General Mobile Radio Service (GMRS). Both of these services are available in Canada and the USA. However, as September 28th, 2017 there are some substantial differences in these services in the two countries.

There are four main differences between the countries.

- Output power level,
- Channel assignments to frequency
- Emission types
- Bandwidth.

•

As a result you can not us a USA model radio in

Canada. Emission types and bandwidth difference can be found at the following web sites.

Channel assignment to Frequency and power levels are easily shown in the chart below.

As Amateur Radio operators, you should know that you can not use your Amateur Radio in any other service other than amateur radio as it is not type approved. This is even if it is capable of transmitting on frequencies out of the amateur radio bands, such as the FRS & GMRS services. So your various flavours of Chinese radios as well as the big three that are capable of out of band transmissions, should not be used in the FRS or GMRS services.
