At press time, ARES members have not played a role in 2019 Flood Operations south of Winnipeg or in Winnipeg. Thanks to Winnipeg ARES members Garry Frankel VE4VD and Dave Stimpson VE4DJS who volunteered to be available as a deployable GO Team outside of Winnipeg if required. Thanks also to South Central ARES members Tedd Vidler VE4VID, Darcy Wilson VE4DDW and Brian Pettapiece VE4NQ who volunteered to make up another GO Team if required outside of their home communities. Early on we decided that we would not staff VE4EMO if there were no GO Teams in the field.

Although not involved in Flood Operations several ARES Units did ensure that their equipment at amateur-equipped Emergency Operations Centres (EOCs) was good to go. We ensured that VE4EMO was ready to go on VHF/UHF once the HF antenna was identified as being out of service. Don VE4DWG reprogrammed VE4EMO and VE4EMC dual-band radios and spares to ensure that programming was up-to-date. Interim Updated Instructions for VE4EMO were shared with the VE4EMO Team.

Jim VE4SIG attended the Winnipeg EOC with me more than once to identify "our" feedline, survey the temporary EOC room and meet with Radio Shop personnel.

Electrical Noise Mitigated By Gord VE4GLS

Just thought I should share this with the group.

Had a Hydro lineman show up a few days ago to check on a few things in my farm yard, one of which was the high noise level from the primary line running through the yard. I gave him the results of testing I had done so far and where I believed the noise was being broadcast from, and brought out a small AM radio to demonstrate. He realized right away there was a problem. After some minor trouble-shooting the problem was found to be a lightning/surge arrestor connected in series with the transformer. This is a 6KV device set to shunt any excess voltage to ground causing the fuse to pop open or blow. It was obviously conductive well below this voltage, and was quite warm when it was disconnected and removed. Primary line voltage here is 4400v. A new surge arrester device was installed and works properly. AC noise here is zero now.

According to the lineman these devices almost never fail. I am thinking lightning and other causes can occur often so there may be many of these devices that have not "failed" but may be generating RF noise as result of being somewhat conductive. The only easy way to determine this failure mode is to physically remove the device from the circuit and re-energize. I could see this being difficult to request from a utility company, it requires time and equipment (bucket truck) or a lineman to climb up a pole and play with high voltage. Add to this scenario that the type of RF noise is very difficult to pinpoint when there might be several of these devices within 100' in a busy business area etc. Much easier to locate in a rural environment.

Now this device is one of several possible noise generators on a typical electrical utility connection. If one is to report RF noise of this sort, please eliminate as many possibilities as you can, such as turning off your main breaker (and neighbors if you can get permission) and seeing if the noise persists. Do your diligence before calling them!



I attached a picture of the device so you can identify it, in the event this same problem occurs elsewhere.


Spotlight on: Gerry Sherman VE4GKS By David VE4DAR

What have you got out of our hobby? I've met lots of interesting people. My particular interest has been electronics, and I've been deeply involved in that part of the hobby.


Public service? I had a VE3- call in Toronto and was with the Olympic Committee in 1980. CANWARN, ARES, and marathons.

Mobile Antenna Mounting Consideration



A typical 5/8 wave 145 MHz (2 meter) antenna requires a ground plane of at least 42" in diameter. At 450 MHz just 15" is required and at 800 MHz a minimum of 8" is considered sufficient.

In terms of mounting mobile antennas on a vehicle, there are five general locations: the roof, front fender, rear fender, trunk and rear window glass (although other glass mount locations may be used). Of these, the center of an automobile roof is considered the best for mobile antenna placement, followed by the center of the trunk lid, the fenders, and then on-glass mounting.
