#### From The President -

Well winter is surely approaching but not necessarily slowly. not sure how many of you had antenna work to do this past summer that you procrastinated on but I will admit to being one. Hopefully the weather will perk up enough to keep my fingers attached to my hands long enough to get my work done.

At the October WARC General meeting Ron Place VE4PL gave a very touching presentation about someone us newer Hams have no knowledge of - Jim Watt VE4VJ. That call sign should be familiar to most of you, it is the call of the UHF repeater on the Richardson building in remembrance of him.

To recap a bit, Jim had cerebral palsy yet managed to get his Amateur Radio license at a time when CW was a requirement! Not only that, but he had a number of ham related inventions under his belt, a positive attitude and a friend to many. Unfortunately he died tragically at the age of 58 when his wheelchair rolled into the Assiniboine River. What is interesting is the impact he left on Hams to this day. He touched other Hams such as Ron such that Ron felt compelled to present his story for the rest of us so that Jim would not be forgotten. Hearing about someone like Jim should make each of us think - is the impact we have on our families, friends, co-workers such that they will be remembering us in a kind light years later? For many it can be a sobering thought.

This reminds me of a sermon I once heard from a minister by the name of Tony Campolo. He was talking about research project that interviewed 100 people who were over 100 years of age to see if there was anything in common they shared that contributed to their longevity. One of the questions they asked of these people is if they wished they would have done anything differently in their lives, or had any regrets. Curiously most of them had 3 regrets in common - they wished they would have spent more time in reflection, they wished they would have taken more chances, and something Jim Watt succeeded in doing - they wished they would have done something that they would be remembered by.

Build or buy? "I bought used commercial equipment and built some 2m antennas."

Contacts or moments that stick out in memory? "My first contact was with VE4ACN on 2m while driving to Brandon. Then by HF to Arizona in the winters. Some DX. During the late 70's and early 80's signals were much better than now. HF was open. Thus, I was inspired."

What have you gotten out of ham radio over the years? "Good friends. Opportunities to work the Manitoba Marathon. A nice way to spend an afternoon, even if you just listened. HF has interested me the most."

Public service? "Manitoba Marathons. Member of ARES."

Advice for new hams: "Be active. Get on the air. Be sure to get on HF, the core of Amateur Radio. Join and support organizations such as WARC, RAC, ARES, and MRS.

Future of Amateur Radio? "It will continue; not disappear. It will become more computer oriented." Thanks for this, Jim.
