# Spotlight on Henry Hessner VE4AUT By David VE4DAR

What got you interested in amateur radio? "I was always interested in listening to radio. As a youngster I had a crystal set. When I retired, I got my licence."



Take a class or study on your own? "I took a class at Sturgeon Creek High School and got my Basic in April 2000."

Build or buy? "I bought a 440 transceiver and R5 antenna. I built some VHF antennas."

Contacts or moments that stick out in memory? "I contacted an American Navy pilot in flight. Of course, he didn't give his location. Many contacted him afterwards. I also talked with a ham in Kuwait after Jim Rogan told me to get on the air and get him. Many American operators tried to drown me out, but the Kuwaiti told them to stand by until I was done."

What have you gotten out of ham radio? "I made some new friends. I was introduced to Satellite operations." (David's note: Henry was instrumental in establishing and maintaining the Satellite station at VE4WSC, where he is still involved.)

Any particular interest in ham radio? "I have an overall interest: VHF, UHF, HF and now digital."

Public Service? "Since 2000, I've been a member of the Seniors, where I've helped with public displays and open houses. I was appointed to the Honour Roll in 2004. I'm still active as a Board Member."

Advice for new Hams? "Come to the Seniors and try out our equipment. We have all modes and types. Get on the air; be active. Check out the new ideas on the Internet."

Future of Amateur Radio? "It will keep going and be active. New programs are always being developed. It's a challenge for new hams to work all modes." Thanks for this, Henry.


## Are you meeting for daytime coffee?


