Spotlight On Drago Lambeta VE4DBV By David VE4DAR

What got you interested in Amateur Radio? "As a youth in Croatia, I noticed radio was a good way to communicate, especially with ships around the world."



Class or study on your own? I was first licenced in 1980 in Croatia, after taking a ham class in high school. Later, while studying mechanical engineering at the University of Manitoba, I took a class and got my VE4 qualification."

Build or buy equipment? "In Croatia I built a 10m tube transmitter; bought my receiver, and built my antennas."

Contacts or moments that stick out? "With few working phones in Croatia during the civil war, amateur radio was used for families to contact their relatives elsewhere. I helped. More recently, my son and I have talked with the International Space Station."

What have you gotten out of ham radio? "I've used amateur radio to help others. I've become an accredited examiner."

Any part of ham radio that interested you particularly? "Digital radio."

Public service? "During the Croatian civil war I helped families communicate with each other. Here, I've helped with the Manitoba Marathon, Air Force Run, and Santa Parade. Now I'm Treasurer for the Winnipeg Senior Citizens Radio Club."

Advice for new hams? Amateur Radio is a great opportunity to experience wireless communications without great expense. Get involved with the clubs."

Future of Amateur Radio? "It's declining because of modern technologies. CW is just barely surviving. We need "new blood" to keep the hobby alive. We need to be sure to use our frequencies to keep them."

If you need help making a Code Plug, please ask for help from the Winnipeg Digital Repeater Group. When making your Code Plug, please remember Time Slot 1 is static linked to the Manitoba Talk Group (3024). Please avoid using it for other Talk Groups.

Make sure TX Admit is set to Color Code Free/Same Color Code

Time Slot 2 is static linked for Local, but you are encouraged to bring up other Talk Groups (that is what makes DMR interesting).

When using your radio, please remember that there are other users on the system. Please consider joining the Winnipeg Digital Repeater Group to help support the system Lastly, have fun and enjoy!
