Confessions of a Casual Contester #11 From the shack of DavidVE4DL

I am not now, nor ever have been, a Contester. I don't see myself becoming a Contester either, if one defines the term to include round-the-clock operations, intravenous fluids and diapers, and frequent relays of cold, one-hand meals. Not my thing, at all. BUT......

Well, I lied. I did contest in January. The North American QSO Parties for CW and SSB happen in the first two weeks of the month, and I couldn't resist. I may have mentioned that QSO parties are an easy entry to the world of 'contesting', but may have failed to mention that they are the 'gateway contest' to those who are prone to addiction. Also, the NAQP is nothing like the typical state or club QSO party that go on throughout the year. No. NAQP is full-on gang-buster contesting, with occasional polite thank-yous. As usual, I did better in the earlier CW event than in the follow-on SSB contest. Keying is just faster than speaking, no way around that. Conditions were not stellar for either event, neither.

Once again, I used the N3FJP contest logger for both. Neat, simple, easy. Everything I need a logger to be. On CW, the whole exchange is canned and sent by F-key. Questions can be answered with the paddle if needed. On phone, the logger can send one of the 4 voice memories in my TS-590S, so the CQ and my callsign are recorded, and sent by F-key. Saves my voice, calling endlessly into the night. With only 4 memories, the exchange is sent by speaking live, no way to cover all the bases, else.

I may also have to re-title this blog – I joined Radio-Sport Manitoba this month, so officially I AM a contester now. Change is all part of life.

When I first started N1MM logging contests a couple of years ago, I was using the spotter networks to find contacts. "Running assisted" is the term. This works, certainly, and can pile up needed QSOs when the bands are busy. In the few contests of last summer I was noticing that I'd run through all the spotted stations, but there were plenty more to be heard, but not 'seen', as it were. So this year my plan is to go unassisted in all contests, and see if I get more or less QSOs than last year (very unscientific.) The technique is simple enough, and more hams do this than the other. We shall see.

No contest this weekend. Withdrawal? No, relief. I did spend some time on phone, calling CQ on 17m yesterday, netted 10 casual QSO in an hour or so. Very relaxed, no pressure. I like 17m, it is a very low-noise band with my set-up. The usual suspects were collared — mostly CA and TX with a couple of others.

I've also been working Straight Key Month as the MB special event station. I've been operating mid-day, around 21Z, on whatever band seems open at the time. This is excellent practice for handling pile-ups. Usually a few CQ calls go unanswered then the pile-up begins. Most days I don't call CQ again for an hour. I ran 15

days in the month, which is good for me. 13 mid-day, one mid-night and one pre-dawn slot. I got anywhere from 5 (midnight – all VE. Don't Canajins sleep?) to 19 (pre-dawn) QSO an hour at speeds ranging from 10-20wpm. I love my VizKey Camelback, it's so easy on the wrist. Still in business, way backlogged apparently.

Today is Winter Field Day, and as I'm not allowed out, I will not play. Good luck to all on the air.

But it isn't contesting. Nope. Not at all.
