Confessions of a Casual Contester #12 From the shack of DavidVE4DLA

I am not now, nor ever have been, a Contester. I don't see myself becoming a Contester either, if one defines the term to include round-the-clock operations, intravenous fluids and diapers, and frequent relays of cold, one-hand meals. Not my thing, at all. BUT......

It's been a while since I've sat at this keyboard, I've been dealing with health and business issues in the interim. Put a few contacts in the log, not a lot. Heard that I did well in the last RTTY contest, which only goes to show there are not enough RTTY contesters in Canada. Come on, peeps! Give me a run for my money, here. Added WAS-mixed to my wallpaper.

Thinking about my next antenna – I have most of an OCFD set-up that came in a \$5 mystery box from the 2018 Fall Flea Market, never even stretched out the pieces. There's a balun and a bunch of flexweave wire in the box, and a tattered instruction sheet. Should be enough to start with. I can get the centre an easy 20' above the roof here, or 33' above ground. Should be good for most purposes I need it for. Maybe next month?

I also acquired a RemoteHams control box off the KWARC S&S. This is a good online swapmeet that I check every couple of days. I think about a third of my shack has come from this one source. The idea is to simplify the interface at home, to run my shack via RemoteHams client/server software but avoid some of the pitfalls of third party software not playing nicely with what I have. I'll be melting solder later today, prepping cables for the installation.

Starting my research for my May WARC presentation on logging software. This is to be an overview of the field, rather than an in-depth tutorial on a particular app, so please remember to check in and find out how little I know......

In February I started a pseudo-net for newbie CW ops, running on the 10m and 12m bands twice a week. The idea is for those who want live practice with real people to tune up at the appointed time/freq and call CQ MB CW. Chat with whoever answers. In the current solar climate, these bands are strictly local ground-wave propagation, so here's a chance to be on the air with no fear of the Kalifornia Kilowatter or HighSpeed from Helsinki butting in. Only your own neighbours can hear you. I've been unable to monitor its progress, but I'm told there are a dedicated few getting in their practice time. Join them and grow the group. Details are announced on the VHF Net. A year from now it may not be so local and private any more. Don't delay!

Once you're comfortable with chatting across town, I highly recommend looking into the Straight Key Century Club and the Long Island CW Club for more practice with a wider range of ops. There is also the CW Academy to grow your skills quickly (relatively.)

Notice Concerning MRS 2 Meter Nets

I am making some changes to the Manitoba Repeater Society 2 Meter Net, held Sundays and Thursdays at 9:00 pm, on VE4WPG, and other linked repeaters. I have updated the net script. I have dropped the reference to "emergency training". There has never been "emergency training" on this net. I have dropped references to links to other clubs and systems. There has been no connection to repeaters in Brandon, the Interlake, and Northwestern Ontario for some time. If these links return, I will amend the script to reflect that.

I am keeping the present format for calling stations by area, since it allows everybody who wishes to check in, to do it efficiently.

Most nets are over by 9:20 pm, including the Swap and Shop. When the current script began, around 1995 there were typically between 75-100 check ins. The nets frequently lasted for an hour. It was necessary to speed up proceedings, by reducing unnecessary comments.

Currently there are about 30 people checking in nightly. I would like to see more people checking in. I would also like to extend the net by about 20 minutes each time, by having hams say a few words when checking in. (just a few words, not a 600 page novel, hi hi)
