The Winnipeg Amateur Radio Club in partnership with the WSC is pleased to announce the co-hosting of the 2023 Field Day event at the newly renovated WSC clubhouse. All amateurs are invited to come by and join the fun. Bring along any friends to find out what Amateur Radio is all about as we participate in the ARRL Field Day. We will have multiple operating stations running in different bands and modes including voice, CW, and some digital modes like FT8 on HF, as well as a VHF/UHF satellite and terrestrial operations.

Are you a new radio operator? Do you find operating HF daunting? Would you like to see what these new digital modes are all about? Field Day, while a contest promoting emergency preparedness, is also a fun event. Come out to Field Day and see what it is all about or bring your own Field Day setup and try it. Sit with experienced operators, who will guide you along the process of making that first HF contact. Show you how to log entries in a contest and what information to exchange. Learn the difference between hunting or running.

Or come out for the social aspect. Enjoy a day of fellowship with your fellow radio operators. There will be a BBQ, beverages, and snacks for all who want to venture out for a fun-filled event that will surely be a hit throughout the day and night. Perhaps even some pizza later into the evening for those operators who stick it out.

Field Day operations this year will be mainly held inside so there will be no fear of foul weather or flying annoyances. As a bonus and if the weather is good, we will have an outdoor station on the front driveway to make contacts and to show the public what Amateur radio is all about.

#### Spotlight on Calvin Winter VE4AJ By David VE4DAR

"I got interested in Ham Radio at about 7 yrs as I looked for ways to take apart every radio in our house. In fact I remodeled a dresser in my room to put in a

speaker. I drilled holes for hearing the radio, and mounted the old tube radio on top. It sounded good for a mono radio. I also got quite a shock from touching the chassis, which had direct wire connections to tube sockets! Then I noticed a rather large odd shaped antenna on a crank up antenna at one of our neighbours in Wildwood Park. It was made in Transcona. One day I knocked; we talked; and he showed me his ham radio and the autopatch equipment. He got me on the air and I was interested. Unfortunately it was-



n't until 1978 that I was licenced."

"When I was about 17 I started flying lessons and got my private pilots licence. I enjoyed talking on the VHF radio. During grade 12 I really didn't know what to do next, but there was a radio course at Red River Community Collage that I enrolled in. My Class 2 radio licence allowed me to work commercially as a radio operator for Transport Canada Flight Service Stations (FSS). I found out to that to work for Transport Canada as a FSS radio operator you had to work in North-

ern Canada first, then all over. So I decided not to and decided to become a commercial pilot. I got my first pilot's job and went North."

"My flying job took me to Flin Flon, where I met several ham radio operators through the Flin Flon repeater, and had many, many interesting days and nights. Eventually one of the local hams sold me his Kenwood TS820S, remote VFO 820 and Kenwood remote manual tuner (AT230), and I still them have today. I experimented with putting a VHF radio and antenna in a Cessna 185 and talking back to the other operators via the Flin Flon Repeater. but I never did build my own station."

"I don't have any specific contacts that I remember although while working with Transport Canada as an Aviation Inspector another Inspector (Lee – VE4LS) and I would use the aircraft's HF radio system and place CQ, CQ, CQ, Aeronautical mobile calls. Immediately after, we would get quite a few replies."

What have you gotten out of ham radio? "Meeting lots of people, helping out along with friends and having fun comes to mind."

Any particular interest? "As a ham radio operator I was able to copy and send 35 words per minute on a straight key but that was a very long time ago. I am trying to get back into CW."

Any public service? "As a public servant I helped ensure that aviation in Canada was safe for the flying public. I was also directly involved with the floods in Manitoba to ensure aviation safety. During the Fort McMurry forest fires, I was directly involved to ensure the airspace around the Fort McMurray air-port was used only for fire fighting aircraft and support. Regarding Ham Radio, my work schedule as a commercial pilot and Aviation Inspector prevented me from helping much."

Any advice to new hams? "Have fun and get on the air; don't be afraid of the microphone. You can start out on the Saturday Morning Net with other new hams."

What's the future of amateur radio? "I believe Digital Radio and Hotspots are the future, but we also need to ensure our new hams get on the radio."

#### Confessions of a Casual Contester Vol. 3 Issue 9 from the shack of David VE4DLA

I am not now, nor ever have been, a Contester. I don't see myself becoming a Contester either, if one defines the term to include round-the-clock operations, intravenous fluids and diapers, and frequent relays of cold, one-hand meals. Not my thing, at all. BUT.....

May has been a slow month for me, doing some casual DX on the remote, staring at the vagi on my patio and waiting to hear from the bucket-truck guy. In the meantime I've been slowly rearranging the shack. I added an MFJ-1263 mic/radio switch to the setup. I can now switch between boom-mic/spkr and headset at the touch of a button, instead of unscrewing/re-screwing the connectors. Very convenient.

The box was a used one from KWARC swapshop, and it was missing some of the jumpers (it had enough to do the job, but not all the original number.) I contacted MFJ customer service to ask if I could buy a bag of jumpers, and lo and behold, a bag of jumpers appears a week later, free and gratis. This is great customer service in my humble opinion. Especially as it was sent FedEx international. They could have mailed it in a standard envelope easily.

I also swapped out the Kenwood SP-930 speaker for a Heathkit SB-600 unit. The original was a bit hit and miss, even after re-capping it. Modern cheepshit components are not a good match for the originals. I'm also a believer in bigger speakers are better speakers (within limits. I wouldn't hook up my brother's Voice of the Theatre units to a ham radio.)

I moved the rotator controller up from beside the radio to the shelf above (also the home of the mic switch, speaker and monitor.) I rewired and simplified the key and paddles, shortened the cable run for the WinKeyer and shortened some of the ground straps to the busbar. I changed the position of the keyboard shelf to be a more comfortable distance to the monitor. The computer is still the ancient rescue unit I've had all along.

One project hanging fire is adapting my MC-60 mic to the Heil boom. The Kenwood mic is 8-pin, not XLR so I can't adapt the cable I have. I'll save it for future XLR mics I might acquire, or even for the Goldline mic I currently have. I have not found any pre-made, 2m straight, 8pin mic cables. They all seem to be coiled. My usual "mic" cable around the shack is not adequate, but my local supply doesn't stock the heavier stuff Heil uses. Any suggestions would be welcome....

CO WPX is this weekend. If the remote radio at the Club is available, I'll be on from time to time. It's a busy weekend at home, and I'm on course all next week - that needs preparation, too. I'll do what I can in the in-between spaces.


