WPGARES By Jeff, VE4MBQ Emergency Coordinator

The City of Winnipeg Emergency Preparedness Program recently purchased two Yaesu FT-1900R 2m transceivers for Winnipeg ARES use and four Comet CTC-50M Coax Pass-Thru devices. We have been able to withdraw the older Winnipeg ARES-owned transceivers that were in place at VE4EOC and replace them with the new FT-1900R radios. The four CTC-50M pass-thru cables are in four out of five Mobile Radio Kits (our fifth kit is permanently assigned to the WFPS Mobile Command Vehicle).

Our May General Meeting featured the 2011 CAN-WARN Net Controller's briefing (a copy of the presentation has been provided to Winnipeg ARES members) delivered by the writer. The business meeting saw members in attendance adopt the following resolution:

Resolved, that effective immediately for the 2011-12 Dues Year and subsequent years, Winnipeg ARES Annual Dues are increased across the board by ten dollars per member (\$10) including each family member if dues are paid as a family and that a discount of ten dollars per member be offered across the board for each Winnipeg ARES member who is also a member of Radio Amateurs of Canada (RAC).

The rationale for the dues increase (and equal discount for RAC members) is that the new RAC Liability Insurance Plan costs Winnipeg ARES an additional ten dollars per year for those Winnipeg ARES members who are not RAC members.

2011-12 dues for Winnipeg ARES are due in JUNE, our Treasurer Susan VE4SYM will be pleased to take your payment at the JUN General Meeting. 2011-12 dues are \$25 each for non-RAC members (discounted to \$15 for a RAC member), \$35 family rate (discounted to \$25 if all are RAC members). Payment with exact change or via cheque payable to "Winnipeg ARES Inc" would be appreciated.

Flood Operations for the VE4EMO Team started to wrap up on TUE 24 MAY – that was the last day that we actively staffed VE4EMO in the Manitoba Emergency Coordination Centre. ARES members from the fourteen member VE4EMO Team operated there for 43 days straight, early morning thru evening, as long as the ECC was open we were there. WED 25 thru SUN 29th saw us down to an on-call posture.

We had a very successful CANWARN Spotter Training session SAT 28 MAY in Neepawa with 18 Amateurs in attendance from 9 different communities. Further information will be in the summer edition of the MRS Newsletter.

Hello:

Why I am sending you this email is just a gentle reminder that I really need letters of support from 3rd party groups and organizations. If you help with communications for any group or are part of an emergency response procedure for your community we need a letter from them.

I am not looking for a letter asking or telling any one that we need to continue to be able to operate mobile but rather a strong statement that Amateurs are important to the operation of their event or emergency preparedness plan. We need to show the bureaucrats and technocrats that Amateurs are a vital group and provide many community services that so far has gone unnoticed. Stated simply, we need to ???get on their radar???. The letters can be addressed to either Kathleen Wynn or your individual group.

Once the legislators understand that Ontario Amateurs provide a service that fills the needs of many diverse groups and organizations across the province I believe we can change their minds. This logic has worked in other provinces and it will work here as well.
