Adam VE4SN reported that Ed VE4EAR is currently on a Dxpedition to East Timor. The call for the expedition is 4W/K7CO. EAR is particularly interested in hearing VE4's. VE4TTH heard EAR Oct 19 but the signal was weak and he was unable to get a contact as he was swamped by the American kilowatts.

Equipment Bank

David VE4DLA led a discussion of proposed equipment for the equipment bank.

- -He noted that a climbing harness had been donated. The executive proposed purchasing Hard Hats to be lent out with the harness as the use of one requires the other.
- -Crimping tool. Crimping tools for Ethernet cables, Anderson Power Plugs and various coax cables were suggested. VE4TTH noted that while good equipment was expensive it was worth it in the long run. He suggested Palladin equipment as he used them daily in his business and they have proved to be reliable.
- -Antenna Analyzer. Should cover at least HF and VHF. UHF would be desirable.
- -Gin Pole. Still waiting.

- -Inventory and sign out in charge of one club member. Suggested sign out time 1 week.

We still need a Christmas Party coordinator.



Gary VA4RWT distributing IC exams





City of Winnipeg antenna support structure policy ...

As The regional director of Radio Amateurs of Canada I was asked to act on behalf of all the Amateur Radio Operators in Winnipeg for consultation with the City of Winnipeg on a new/revised antenna support structure policy that is being developed from a template issued by the Federation of Municipalities. In the process, I have been able to maintain the exemption for 15m or less in tower height. However the statement that the city prefers amateur radio towers to be less than 21m will most likely be removed. As well as, it now looks like they will be including the antenna as part of the height of the structure. Before, it was only the support structure. I guess they figured out about top mounting as compared to side mounting on cell sites. Now anything over \$15m will be subject to the full consultation process just like anyone else (cellular, and commercial). This process will carry a proposed fee of \$1,076.00. Under 15m for Amateurs is free, just do it.

Some background.

The Federal Government, who has jurisdiction, has stated that the land use authority (city of Winnipeg) must be consulted on any tower being erected. This is to ensure that towers are not put in places Like Assiniboine Park, heritage sites or the Legislature grounds and other public places as examples. Industry Canada will only intervene, if the proponent and the city can not agree on placement and antenna height. And IC will lonely look at the technical data and nothing else. In other words, it must be placed at this site as there is no other site that it will work or it must be this height as a lower height will not work for technical reasons.

Winnipeg and other cities/towns had an antenna support structure protocols in place, but because of pressure from the Federation of Municipalities and the Canadian Wireless Telecommunications Association, the Minister responsible for Industry Canada, agreed to have a template issued that would make it easier for communities to develop their own policy. And to eliminate a loop hole that the Cellular companies were using to get towers erected all over the place. Unfortunately this means that we are placed into the pool of groups who erect towers.

At this point I have gone as far as I can in dealing with the planning committee and if we are to want a higher exemption limit or any lower fees then we need to make a presentation to Council when this comes up for debate. Amateurs are already singles out in the policy due to our placement on residential property, so why not continue to be singled out on height as well.

Reasons for the extra height could be to reduce the interference caused to neighbours equipment, by moving the antenna higher up and away from the neighbour. We need the height for direct line of site with receiving stations, or whatever reasons we can come up with. We must also have the technical data to support it. This will be our last kick at the can, so we might as well make or stance known. Please contact me if you are interested.
