Twenty-five people registered for Basic Short Course 12 on WARC's web site. Eighteen actually paid their fees. Average class attendance was about fifteen. Thirteen wrote the exam including one who did not take the course. Nine passed. All who passed, passed with honours. As usual, the BSC students were quite a diverse lot that included ex-military and retired engineers as well as several high school students. We had two students who are hams in the Philippines getting their Canadian certification. One grade 10 student from Garden City Collegiate and one grade 9 student from Shaftesbury High school passed. Bill Fleury (VE4BEF) a graduate of BSC11 provided two free passes to the Manitoba Amateur Radio Museum (MARM) in Austin to those who wrote exam. Our instructors were fantastic. I especially appreciate the contribution of Jim Townsend (VE4CY) who drives in from Woodlands to teach modulation, transmitters and receivers. Special thanks also to Mark Blumm (VE4MAB) for handling the online Registration process and keeping the web site up to date. Manitoba Schools High Altitude Balloon Symposium

On Wednesday, October 26th, staff and students from Sisler, Garden City, Steinbach, St. James Collegiate, **River East Collegiate, Fort Richmond Collegiate and** Maples Collegiate gathered in the library at Shaftesbury High School for a full day symposium on High Altitude Balloon (HAB) flights. The event was sponsored by the Manitoba Association of Physics Teachers (MAPT). Students and teachers presented on many aspects of HABs including Tracking HAB's using the Automatic Packet Reporting System (APRS) by Maples teacher Andrea Misner (VA4NGC), Becoming a Radio Amateur by Shaftesbury student Nikhil Sharma (VA4NIK) and HAM WAN and the Internet of Things (IOT) by Shaftesbury student Jordan Bowley (VE4JRB). BSC12 graduate Jairuz Agang-Ang (VE4JAI) presented on the Arduino Microcontroller. Jairuz has agreed to be a technical advisor to our HAB

group. Digital copies of the proceedings will be provided to all the participating schools by MAPT. The schools are planning another big HAB flight event in April of 2017. Spotlight on Dave Place VE4PN By David VE4DAR

I've known Ron Place VE4PL since high school, but his younger brother Dave VE4PN is a relatively new acquaintance. I caught Dave with his "coffee group" on Waverly Street one day during one of his shuttles between Selkirk and Winnipeg.



What got you interested in amateur radio? "My brother Ron was licenced so I listened to his QSO's, and it was teletype that really got me interested." "Ron and I had Jimmy Watt VE4VJ as an Elmer, but I got my ticket mostly through my Class 2. "

Note to readers: "Class 2" refers to the Certificate of Proficiency in Radio, 2nd class.

To get a Class 2, Dave took the Radio Operating and Communications Electronics course at the Manitoba In§titute of Technology (MIT) along with HK, SS, AY, CY and UA and others around 1965.

Dave built his own station by collecting "junk" in the back alleys of River Heights and modifying it. "People were getting rid of their tube radios at that time." "In the beginning, Rick Lord VE4OV and I sent CW to each other."

Memorable contacts: "I talked with expeditions going to Galapagos. When earthquakes hit Nicaragua, I passed messages to Trenton, Ontario, prompting the Minister of Defense to send aid from Trenton."

What have you got out of ham radio over the years? "My whole life is talking with people as a counselor. So talking with people, rag chewing, not the contacts, has gotten me into many interesting situations related to disasters. I went to Russia with the Red Cross."

"I like DX. However, mostly I'm interested in public service. I've been involved in large disasters in the U. S. I was a communications manager during the hurricane in Hawaii. I ran communications for St. Clements Municipality during the 1979 flood. I received the Canada 125 medal for Public Service from the Governor General.

Advice for new hams: "Start with used equipment; go to Flea Markets. Find the niche that interests you before spending a lot of money."

What's the future for ham radio? "Lots of digital. I'd like to see Cadet Corps make ham radio a central part of their studies. Need to give them important duties to do

such as back-up communications and public service."

D-Star's "D-Tip" By Garth VE4GWB

With today's radios like the 31/51/5100 etc using SD cards to program from your computer you can store multiple files for each radio on one card so no need to have a card for each radio if you like.

You can have a file setup for different users or download frequency lists for various cities you visit. To swap programming just upload a different file from the card to radio.
