Two major DX-peditions are currently underway.
- FT8WW from Crozet island in the southern ocean between Madagascar and Australia. Single man operation. Best chances to work so far are around 9AM on 20m FT8 longpath and around 5-6pm 30m FT8.
- TN8K from the Congo. Large 6 station operation workable on 12-40m with good signals. 10m, may be open around 10-11am and 80/160m might be possible with top notch stations.
- Bouvet Island is expected to be operational by a large group in the last couple weeks of this month.
- Bouvet (3Y) and Crozet (FT5W) are #3 and #2 respectively on the most wanted DXCC list so work them while you can. They are difficult to get to and seldom activated. Only North Korea is higher on the most

wanted list.

- Otherwise propagation continues to build towards the projected solar peak in 2024/25.

DX Report

- DXpedition 3Y0J to Bouvet Island wrapped up early because of weather and technical issues. Comments made that the DXpedition was plagued by an incredible number of inconsiderate LIDS interfering with 3Y0J's operation making it very difficult for hams to work them, as well as many disparaging posts about the DXpedition on various sites.
- Other significant DXpedition still running is FT8WW on Crozet Island. This is a one man operation using wire antennas and he is limited by the rules put in place for his operations. He does a lot of F* operation.
- Interesting to note that both 3Y0J and FT8WW are number 2 and 3 in the most desirable DX entities list after North Korea and they were both on at the same time.
- Conditions are very good especially on 10, 12, 15, 20, EU good in the mornings and Asia in the evenings.

As governments sell frequencies they allotted to Amateur Radio, and our ham radio operators "age out", it's important that we act to mitigate the situation. Here's my opinion on what we can do.

Numbers count! When DARRF or RAC argues to retain certain frequencies or to acquire new ones, they can expect the question: "How many hams are now using that?" "What's your projected usage?" The City of Winnipeg also might ask how many persons attend their fire station housing WSC or use the equipment there. A funding agency could ask Amateur Radio clubs, "How many members do you have?"

What can we do? We can join and pay dues to the many clubs available. We can participate in various amateur radio events, such as the one at the Seniors on March 4; be sure to sign in! Net control operators count and report the number of stations checking in. You can hear this, and see it reported in RAC's The Canadian Amateur. So check into a net, even if it's only "one for the count." Numbers count!

Each of us has the obligation to recruit new members into our hobby. Can you encourage your kids and grandkids to "get on the air"? Consider doing a presentation about Amateur Radio with others at your local school, or for the Scout group. (I've done it and can offer some suggestions.) What's the chance of taking a workmate or neighbour to a club meeting? At Field Day they can see various aspects of our hobby and actually get on the air.

Let's hope these ideas counter the forces challenging our hobby. 73.

Confessions of a Casual Contester

I am not now, nor ever have been, a Contester. I don't see myself becoming a Contester either, if one defines the term to include round-the-clock operations, intravenous fluids and diapers, and frequent relays of cold, one-hand meals. Not my thing, at all. BUT.....

Winnipeg Senior Citizens Radio Club has an initiative running to introduce more local hams (of any age) to HF operations and contesting. I've been lending a hand as operator/coach over the last few months. Most recently we had VE4WSC on for ARRL International DX, CW edition.

WSCRC (WSC for short) is unique in our area. No other club between Calgary and Toronto (to my knowledge, I'd be happy to be corrected) has a physical building with a permanent radio station for the use of members and guests. They were donated an ICOM IC-7700 and an effort was made to set up a contest station worth playing with. They succeeded! The IC-7700 is fed to either a long-wire antenna for 40 and 80m, or a 3-el yagi on a Yaesu rotator for 10-15-20m. They're high enough up to be effective, even from the urban location (in a disused firehall.)

In the recent contest I and three other ops (one an unlicensed student) put about 22 hrs in the chair. The bands were crowded enough that space to run was difficult to find, so most of the weekend was S&P. When we did run, we were spotted by just about everyone, but rates were never as high as when hunting this time around. Once again, 15m ruled followed by 20 and then 10m. The longer bands were not so good to us.

There was some very interesting DX going on. My own station has been very limited for DX since the last solar maximum, so I was surprised and pleased to work many new or rare-to-me entities. A couple of China. Many Japan including 50W and 5W stations. Heard

the Philippines, didn't work them (Bedlam). Ditto Brunei. New Zealand but no Oz. Europe I think we hit all W of the Urals but only a couple of UK (the vagaries of skip). The Caribbean was underrepresented and South America thin. Alaska and Hawai'i were happy to find us. Most surprising and most treasured was Vanuatu on 15m. A DX-pedition but giving out the contest exchange. There's a QSL card I'll be happy to see. Sitting here today, I kick myself for not calling back with my own callsign.....

It was fun and gratifying to be pulled out from the pileup on the first or second call, even with 100W out. The privilege of being a rare multi ourselves, I guess.

On the home front, my own yagi is still under snow in the backyard, and at -25C it will stay there a while longer. I've been exploring ways and means to make servicing easier in the future. One is a quick-disconnect on the rotor control cable. Yes, you're all face-palming me, I had it wired direct to the rotator. I've learned that lesson now. The base of my HamIV has the 8-screw pad and I've made a 1m pigtail with spades for that. The other end, to hook into the main run of cable, is not yet complete. I looked at the circular connector update, but several people with it told me not to bother. I looked at the Cinch-Jones connectors. Heavy and clunky and not WX-resistant enough.

So I'm going to try automotive Deutsch connectors, which come in a wide variety of configurations including the required 8-pin. They are clip-locked plug and sockets and waterproof. I'm going to use heat-shrink/glue tubing to seal the cable side of things, and it should be good to go. I don't have the official crimper, but it looks like the 15A PowerPole jaw is the right size for these pins. And WSC has the crimper in their workshop.

This blog is focused primarily on HF operations, but I have other interests. I've been playing with digital UHF comms as well. I have a couple of the cheapest DMR radios and I've been trying to get the TYT MD-750 up and running, with a lot of help from my friends. We got it working on Tuesday, I made a couple of QSOs., local and national. Then I got bold and added more talkgroups by myself. POOF! Nothing works. Leave well enough alone, people. It's sage advice. I did a hard reset of the radio, and I'm ready to try again. My Elmer has departed for warmer climes, but I think I have the gist of it....

But it isn't contesting. Nope. Not at all. Well, maybe.... yes it is!

Spotlight on Roger Froebe VE4RLF **By David VE4DAR**

"My interest in Amateur Radio was instilled by Joe Knowles and Luther Simpson, who worked at the CBW transmitter in Carmen Mb. They even repaired my RCA CR 91 A that I bought from Gil Frederick VE4AG."

"Our family was always interested in technology. We built Canada's first helicopter before Igor Sikorsky had his helicopter going; a hydrostatic transmission that International Harvester used; and many farm implements."

"Personally, I have a Private Pilots licence with night endorsement, an advanced Scuba certificate, and have been a photographer since 1965. Finding Canada's 41st meteorite, the Home-wood Meteorite, in 1970, was very exciting."

"I took the Basic Qualification course at the Winnipeg Senior Citizens Radio Club in 1985. Adam Romanchuk was my Elmer for the Basic course and Morse Code. Having the basic qualification only allowed me to buy my ham radio equipment. However, I have built 6 pieces of Heathkit equipment from stereos to electronic test equipment."

Any contacts or moments that stick out in your memory?
"Most of my contacts were on the eastern seaboard of the United States with an occasional one in South America. My vertical antenna was hampered by a ground wire that was too long causing unusual harmonics and interference. Operating in the Scout Winter Camp was one of the most memorable experiences. Contacting W1AW was extra ordinary. Let's not forget operating the radios in the Environment Canada office during an ARES alert."

"What have I gotten from Ham Radio? Well friends and many happy memories of the get togethers. And 4 years of being a duty officer every Monday morning with Adam Romanchuk VE4SN, Ed Henderson VE4YU and Ed Oakes VE4OAK. The Monday morning net is a particular favourite as I catch up on what my friends are doing."

"CW has always intrigued me. I have been studying CW for over 60 years. Luther Simpson VE4LS had me learning code as I was driving machinery on our farm long before I had my licence. I finally got my 5 WPM certificate on March 25, 2002. While working on the WARC radio convention, I met people from all over North America."

"For public service I have worked with ARES, Environment Canada, and the Scouts Winter Jamboree. After David, I was Chief Instructor for WARC's short courses. For about 6 years, I have represented our community on the selection committee of RAC's Radio Hall of Fame."

Any advice for new hams? "How do you explain to new hams what a wonderful experience being a ham radio operator is? If you see an antenna on a house, it doesn't matter where in the world you are, knock on the door and give your call sign in your introduction. The immediate reply is, "Come on in".

What do you see as the future for Amateur Radio? "The future of Amateur Radio is a broad spectrum of CW, SSB and many types of digital communication that haven't even been invented yet."

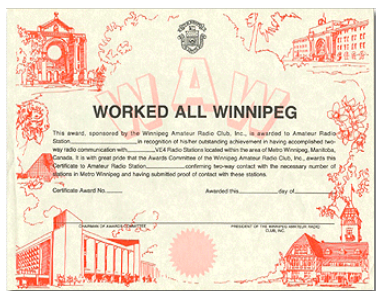
