## **Spotlight on Janice Behrens VE4MMB** By David VE4DAR

What got you interested in amateur radio? Both my mom and dad were Ham **Operators in Alberta and** my dad was a CB Operator as long as I can remember. In fact, my call sign was my CB handle when I was younger - Montana Mosquito Bite - MMB. My work needed a safety mechanism for employees out on the road in remote places. Someone tested satellite radios. I was in the process of testing Amateur Radio mobile units when I



was injured and then Covid locked us down.

Did you take a class; do it on your own, or did you have an Elmer? I attended class on Saturdays with many great instructors. When I graduated with Honours, Lanyse Guay's husband, Bill East, became my Elmer.

My first rig was a present from Bill East...an ICOM mobile unit with a mag antenna. Then I bought myself an ICOM handheld unit.

I was awful at getting on the radio. I started to get my courage up by checking into the net. That was easy...call sign, name, quick call...but I was terrified! The best thing I did was to volunteer to call the net. I'm still awful at the phonetic alphabet, but at least one day a week I get to practice.

What have you gotten out of ham radio over the years? I've met some great people. This is a very supportive community, and they accept me for all of my flaws!

Any part of ham radio that interested you particularly? I'm actually wanting to learn CW, and there's a rumour out there that Drago will be holding a class in October.

What kind of public service have you done? I'm a net control operator and duty officer on Monday mornings. This year I volunteered for the Manitoba Marathon for the first time. Mariska and I were in a spot near the start of the race, Relay 1.

Any advice for new hams? Get on your radio and talk, talk, talk, and ask questions. Take advantage of all the knowledge around you.

What do you see as the future for Amateur Radio? I don't think I'm the best one to answer this question as I'm slowly figuring out what is happening in the present day. My guess it's going in two directions: more digital and satellite; and Non digital cw – honing the craft. (and more women!)

I'm staring at all the parts to complete my paddle/key switchbox. Only ambition is wanting at this point.

We're off on a week's vacation soon, hitting the bright lights of Montréal and visiting the no-longer-family farm. It's been quite a while.

September will bring the SKCC Canadian Operator Event back to the airwaves. Once again I am the sked Co-ordinator for 6 callsign areas of Canada. Check online for details at VC3K Home (skccgroup.com). Canadian CW ops will find themselves verrry verrry popuwaaar......

This will be a season of change in the ham radio community in Manitoba, I think it will renew and refresh the hobby for many.

But it isn't contesting. Nope. Not at all. Well, maybe.... yes it is!
